## PROFESSIONAL PROFILE

I am a Senior Lecturer at Stellenbosch University, South Africa, involved in teaching Social Psychology at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. My expertise also includes teaching multivariate data analyses at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. I have received multiple teaching awards in recognition of teaching excellence.

I have successfully supervised 14 postgraduate theses and/or dissertations to date, along with 28 Honours research assignments.

Between 2004 and 2007 I attended Oxford University as a Rhodes Scholar, completing my Doctoral degree in Social Psychology.

## RESEARCH PROFILE

My research interests include diversity, intergroup contact, intergroup emotions, prejudice and stereotype reduction in post-conflict societies, and interpersonal friendships, and I specialize in advanced quantitative research methodology (including longitudinal survey research and experimental methods) and advanced statistical analyses (including longitudinal, multi-level, and multi-group structural equation modelling).

I have co-authored 12 peer-reviewed articles, 6 peer-reviewed book chapters to date, and 17 conference presentations. I have published in the *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences*, the *Journal of Personality and Social Psychology*, *Personality and Social Psychology Bulletin*, the *British Journal of Social Psychology*, *Group Processes and Intergroup Relations*, and the *Journal of Social Issues*.

In 2015, I was a co-recipient of the *Gordon Allport Intergroup Relations Prize* for "the best paper or article of the year on intergroup relations" from the Society for Psychological Study of Social Issues (USA).

I hold a Y1 researcher rating from the National Research Foundation in South Africa.
