I am an Associate Professor at Stellenbosch University, South Africa. I teach Social Psychology at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. I have also taught multivariate data analyses at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. I am the undergraduate program coordinator for the Department of Psychology, with considerable expertise in course development and coordination. I have received multiple teaching awards in recognition of teaching excellence. I have successfully supervised 18 postgraduate theses and/or dissertations and 30 Honours research assignments.

RESEARCH PROFILE

My research interests include diversity, intergroup contact (cross-group friendships), intergroup emotions, prejudice, and stereotypes in post-conflict societies. I specialize in advanced quantitative research methodology (longitudinal survey research and experimental methods) and advanced statistical analyses (longitudinal, multi-level, and multi-group structural equation modelling). I have co-authored 16 peer-reviewed articles, 7 book chapters, and 24 conference presentations. I have published in the *American Psychologist, Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences*, the *Journal of Personality and Social Psychology, Personality and Social Psychology Bulletin*, the *British Journal of Social Psychology, Group Processes and Intergroup Relations*, and the *Journal of Social Issues*. In 2015, I was a co-recipient of the *Gordon Allport Intergroup Relations Prize* for "the best paper or article of the year on intergroup relations" from the Society for Psychological Study of Social Issues (USA).
